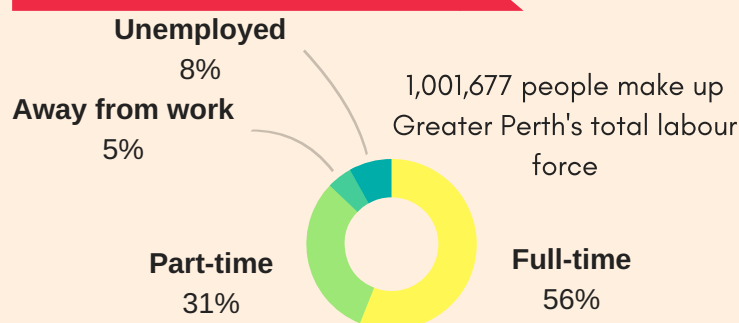

Unemployed persons looking for work has increased by 191.43%



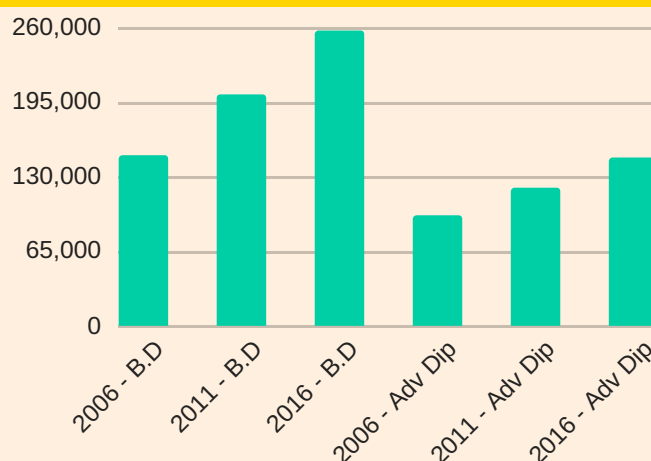
## QUALIFICATIONS

## WORKFORCE



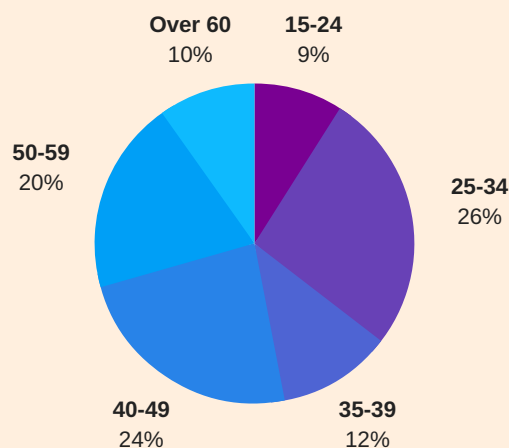
Between 2006 - 2016 there was an increase of 4.5 times the number of over 65's looking for full-time work
